CRECHE

Although the cold weather has come to creche in term 2, we haven't let that stop us from having the best time with the children. We have welcomed Kate our new educator at Orroroo. She has fit right in and already built some great relationships with the children.

We were lucky enough to have Bush Buddies visit at the beginning of the term which was a great experience for all the children. They were able to learn about the animals that were on show as well as get up close and hold and pat them. We were very proud of the children for their great listening skills and for their bravery when holding some slithery scary creatures.





Hawker had a special dentist visit in Week 8 where the children all had their teeth checked and received a new toothbrush and toothpaste. Di from Dental on Commercial, spoke to the children about how to brush our teeth correctly and regularly as well as healthy options of food to keep our teeth free from decay. We are in the process of organising a dentist visit for Orroroo, possibly next term.

This term has seen us celebrate Reconciliation Week and NAIDOC Week. We have brought along some traditional learning activities for the children to experience; painting, beading, instruments, and clay have all been popular. We read some stories during group time to further the children's knowledge in this area and tried our hand at replicating Aboriginal symbols onto whiteboards during the mat time, which they were really very good at. We plan to incorporate these activities throughout the year in our usual program.

CRECHE

At creche we have been gauging children's interests and trying to plan activities and resources to extend them in these areas. We have had a lot of sand pit play with big shovels and cooking equipment to enable them to role play, use their social skills and communicate with their peers and educators. Construction has been a big area of enjoyment and we have seen some creative things being built with the different resources we bring along. Sensory play is always popular amongst the children, so we have tried to change up the activities with the Playdoh and introduced different sensory ideas such as rice, moon sand and clay. If there is a particular area your child has an interest in, please let us know and we can add it to our program.



As the cold weather continues, please refrain from sending children to creche if they are sick or unwell. We don't want the spread of germs through the centres or amongst the staff. We love seeing all our children happy and healthy and enjoying creche.

I hope all the children have had a wonderful term at creche and we will be busy organising activities for next term during the holiday break.

New children will be welcomed with Kindy Experience Days for all our Preschool children in Week One of next term.



Make Your Own LAVA LAMP

YOU WILL NEED

- Baking soda
- Vegetable oil
- Vinegar
- Food colouring
- Clear plastic bottle/ tall clear glass
- Spoon
- Small cup



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Add 3 tspns of baking soda to the bottom of your bottle


